A Message From Our Executive Director



arm greetings from Casa Fugazi in North Beach. It is with deep gratitude that I write this letter as the newest Executive Director of Italian Community Services. Since April, I have had the honor of serving our Bay Area Italian

and Italian-American community. As an "Italiana nel cuore" it is a privilege to be able to serve a community that I both admire and cherish. With ICS celebrating it's 107th year in 2023, I am thankful to those who have come before me as they have laid a strong foundation to continuously evolve and adapt to the dynamic needs of our community.

While meeting over caffè is always preferred, until then, allow me to share a bit about my background, reflections on my first few months as the Executive Director, and some words on current and future programming at ICS.

To start off, my family and I love North Beach. Collectively, my husband and I have lived in North Beach for 30+ years and are now raising our young son here. When I moved to San Francisco after graduate school, I was drawn to North Beach because of its Italian roots. I had the privilege of living in Italy for almost a year (across Tuscany and then in Rome) as well as studying Italian, which is why I am conversational in a beautiful language I call "spoken

Before my time as the Executive Director of ICS, I served as a Board Member. This is because I believe in the nonprofit sector. What I mean is that nonprofits are the hands and feet of our communities. They are feeding those in need, they are connectors to vital services, they are equipping the next generation, they are providing community spaces. ICS has

been doing this and more for over 100 years, which is why I believe in our work.

Speaking of our work, I've been humbled over the last several months to have met so many volunteers, donors, partners and overall supporters of our work at ICS. It means a great deal to know how much goodwill there is in our community towards our mission and work. Whether it's a dedicated volunteer who serves at our weekly luncheons, or a donor who generously gives over and over again, or a partner who donates goods for our care packages, or grantees who write letters for our seniors - you all inspire me and my team to do even more for our

Over the last several months, we've been navigating the new normal as our world and community begin to slowly re-open and re-gather. During this transitional period, we've remained dedicated to the mission of preserving our culture and serving our community. As we approach the new year, we continue to listen to our community to determine how to best support and serve. We plan to continue our current initiatives and create new opportunities to provide support, which includes the following:

Transportation

We are looking to make connecting with the community in-person easier for seniors by assisting with transportation needs, not only to help them join us for our weekly events, but to run errands, visit the doctor, and more. We aim to combine volunteer, ride-share, and shared van options to meet this community need.

Training and Connections

Technology is both an opportunity and a challenge for many in our community. Based on a recent tech survey conducted within our community-specific tutorials, including in-home assistance will be offered leveraging partner organizations and volun-

To further combat isolation, ICS is re-launching the FriendLine phone call program to ensure our community members have a friendly and regular point of contact.

Youth Engagement

Preserving Italian culture is a foundational value of ICS. In 2023 we will place more emphasis on better engaging our youth. We'd like to encourage our Italian and Italian American young people to remember the accomplishments of those who came before them, while also inspiring them to make their

Expanded Direct Community Support

As we prioritize the requests of our community, we work to ensure our community's basic needs are met. We do this through targeted financial support which includes rent, utilities, and grocery assistance for those who most need it within our community. As costs continue to rise, we see more need in this

MERITAGE PARADE

San Francisco's Italian-American Community celebrates the Italian Heritage Festival & Parade every October, featuring Italian and Italian-American dignitaries, music, performances, floats, and representatives of our fellow Italian and Italian-American organizations and businesses. This year, Italian Community Services collaborated with Club Fugazi Experiences to promote our home and 109 year old building - Casa Fugazi!

Casa Fugazi, a gift to the Italian community from the Fugazi family, was entrusted to ICS in 1916. Located on 678 Green St, the third floor remains the home for Italian Community Services and the first two floors, a popular theatrical venue, are now the home of Club Fugazi Experiences, also known

as CFE.

On this year's float, ICS featured many of its com-

munity members, along with the cast and crew of Dear San Francisco – a contemporary circus show by CFE that serves as a "love letter to San Francisco" and pays homage to the Italian roots of North Beach.

Casa Fugazi remains a prominent figure for entertainment and a sanctuary for the Italian Community. Thank you Club Fugazi Experiences for partnering with ICS for this year's float and for joining Italian Community Services in honoring the history of the beautiful building that is Casa Fugazi, a true gift to the Italian community in North Beach.

CLIENT ACTIVITIES

Before COVID-19 hit our community, Italian Community Services held Wednesday Luncheons and Thursday Activities for the senior community. In order to protect its most vulnerable population, ICS closed its doors during COVID-19 and opted for care package deliveries to continue to engage with the community. This year, ICS is proud to share that we were able to safely bring back weekly meals, presentations, field trips, and activities again! Since April we've been able to host more than 60 events (luncheons, activities, concerts) with our clients at our office.

Our Wednesday Luncheons and Senior Activities, supported by weekly volunteers, are organized with the goal of forging relationships, reducing isolation, and preserving the Italian culture. Every month, a calendar of activities are sent to community members

Pasquale

In November, we were able to reconnect one of our community members, Pasquale, with his family in Italy after having been out of touch for nearly 40 years! This all started when we learned that Pasquale had lost touch with his family in New York after experiencing multiple challenging times, including homelessness. Pasquale had no idea how his family had

fared over the years. Were they still in New York? Had some of them passed away? His family also had no idea of what Pasquale had experienced and whether he was even alive after all this time.

With the help of Miracle Messages, a local nonprofit, their team was able to quickly track down Pasquale's family in New York as well as in Naples. After a week of processing the news that his family desperately wanted not only to reconnect and catch up but have him back in their lives, we assisted Pasquale in calling his family in Napoli.

We helped Pasquale navigate the technology needed to reconnect with his family, and he was able to video chat with his siblings. It was heartwarmingly beautiful to see their interactions, even with barely recognizing each other after so much time.

We are working to help more people in similar situations to Pasquale connect more with the community as well as their loved ones by creating opportunities for our seniors to receive training on how to use various technologies such as Zoom that many of us use daily to connect.
