ear community members, hope this finds you healthy and staying indoors. In these uncertain times, Community Services become a voice of hope and inspiration for our Bay Area

Italian/Italian-American community. In early March we began operating remotely; despite some initial challenges, we continue to serve our community. Today, instead of hosting weekly socializing activities, presentations, concerts, cultural events and catered meals, we are working around the clock to provide telephonic wellness checks to hundreds of community members. When an urgent errand is needed such as a pharmacy run, we coordinate to have this done. We have also initiated a care-package tradition where every two weeks we bring our seniors some fresh organic produce, informational materials on the pandemic, foods from Italy, and recipes from our very own Viola Buitoni. Our community's younger population has also been hit very hard. Many of them find themselves applying for unemployment or have had their hours significantly reduced and we are dedicated to providing them the support they

need to navigate through this difficult time.

To be more inviting, we have removed the language "Welfare Agency" and created new materials to provide a fresh image (especially for those who frequented Fugazi years ago). A special thanks goes to Frank Billante (board member and owner of Home Instead Senior Care) and Sharon Meagher for making available to Italian Community Services a virtual platform that is rich with programming. This way you can stroll through the Uffizi or see an opera at the MET from the comfort of your own home. Visit our website and give it a try!

Social and physical isolation is one of the greatest ills of this pandemic. We thank La Scuola International and the middle school for teaming up with Italian Community Services for a cross generational Pen Pal program.

On May 2nd we had our debut in the Wall Street Journal. The article is available on our website under the "news" section. Thank you to Gio Gelati for collaborating and delivering gelato to our most isolated members.

I encourage members of every Italian and Italian-American organization to participate in one of our initiatives. It takes a village and in working together our efforts can have a lasting effect. So far, we have enjoyed teaming up with

members of San Francisco The Italian Athletic Club, La Scuola International, Le Donne D'Italia, Italian Cultural Institute, Italian Consulate of San Francisco, the Italian Catholic Federation, Next Village and Italian Community Services Auxiliary. My commitment is to engage at least one member of each Italian/Italian-American organization to participate in one of our initiatives.

Lastly, I thank all our donors for their generosity. I invite more readers to donate. You can donate via check, via our website, or on Facebook. Since the outbreak we have tripled the people we are serving and we anticipate this growth will continue through the summer. If you cannot donate financially, we also need hardware items such as laptops, computers, tablets and handheld devices. We will use this equipment in our future computer lab to help our seniors stay connected.


